A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

One of my favorite quotes about Lauren Gunderson's Silent Sky calls this play "an intellectual epic told on an intimate scale" (Atlanta Journal-Constitution). Both the story and the process of bringing it to life has hit all the notes of The WordPlayers' quest for unity, integrity, and the pursuit of excellence as we tell culturally-relevant stories from a faith-based perspective. If I had to choose something about the cast and crew that stuck out the most to me, it would be this: Work ethic always trumps talent. The amount of talent involved in this production in the cast, projections design, costume design, stage management, set – all of it – was top tier. However, the biggest factor was not so much "talent" as it was the work ethic and determination everyone displayed. It was nothing short of inspiring.

If I had to choose one thing about the story, it would be difficult. The struggle for equality in all its forms is certainly dear to my heart beyond words. But, perhaps, what hits me most deeply is the reminder that whatever your idea of the Creator may be, the extent of the universe clearly shows the Creator's lavish disregard for efficiency. Because of what I believe about the Creator, I find this comforting. It seems gracious and fatherly to surround one livable planet with more discoveries than its creatures could possibly make. I seek to give my sons opportunities to discover that, though the world may be dark, creation is beautiful. I want them to make their own discoveries, be filled with their own wonders, with me by their side to guide and encourage. On both the epic and intimate scales, Silent Sky sparks my hunger for discoveries, from star filled skies to close relationships. May we all take the time.

Lastly, an important note: you may notice, in the play, some words or phrases that to some folks are perfectly normal, and yet to others are potentially offensive. In our effort to tell "culturally relevant stories," especially in the case of true history, we find that we must honor the characters and meet them where they are at the time of the story. Some of these characters might say things that you, or I, might not say. Yet to force them to speak like us, or follow our own personal rules, robs us of the chance to learn from the actual story at hand. Thus, if you wonder why we have not altered the words given to us by the playwright, it is because of this. This is a discussion that I, of course, am willing to continue if needed. In the meantime, enjoy discovering.
